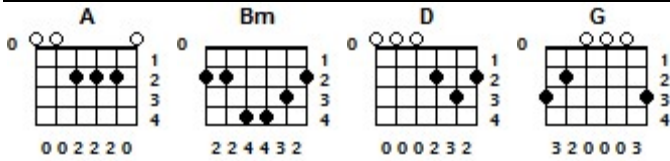


COAT OF MANY COLOURS
